Called Washington's most powerful journalist, NBC News political director Chuck Todd has helped shaped our understanding of American and world politics for more than twenty-five years.

Now moderator of NBC's "Meet The Press," the one-time French horn player and drum major from Miami Killian Senior High's Class of 1990 got his professional start with the National Journal's "The Hotline," where he worked for fifteen years, including six as editor-in-chief.

Recruited to NBC in 2007, Chuck has gained renown for his news-making reporting and deep-dive interviews with such power players as Hillary Clinton, Paul Ryan, Colin Powell, and Presidents Barack Obama and Donald Trump.

Before joining "Meet the Press" in 2014, he
worked as chief White House correspondent, traveling around
the world with President Obama and authoring two books
on Obama's 2008 campaign and his administration, while
also serving four years as host of MSNBC's "The Daily
Rundown."

A Sunset Park Elementary and Southwood Junior High graduate, Chuck earned high praise in 2016 from his fellow journalists for his tough questioning in the year's presidential campaign and election coverage, with one calling his work as a primary debate moderator "a model for all debates."

For his role in shaping our understanding of government and politics in complex times and for setting the highest standards of excellence in political journalism for more than 25 years, we are proud to welcome Chuck Todd to the Miami-Dade County Public Schools Alumni Hall of Fame.
