West Miami Middle School: In collaboration with partners, West Miami Middle School opened a Verizon Innovative Learning Lab. This lab will ensure that students, educators, and staff can utilize technology to further enhance the learning environment.

The Allapattah Wynwood School: Private school abruptly closed after 30 years of operation leaving 150 students displaced. Central Region Schools has registered 13 students into MDCPS.

Registration: Central Region is having Increased number of registrations from incoming immigrants from Cuba, Venezuela, Haiti, and Nicaragua.

Registrar Induction Support & Experiential (R.I.S.E.) Academy January 18, 2023, 8:30a-3:30pm

The Office of Professional Learning and Career Development along with The Federal & State Compliance Office (FASCO) have collaborated to implement the "Registrar Induction Support & Experiential (R.I.S.E) Academy". The main objective of the Academy is to prepare newly hired Registrars to effectively assume the responsibilities of the position by providing direct instructions, best practices, valuable resources, and ongoing support.

Office of Intergovernmental Affairs & Family and Community Engagement

The Office of Mental Health and Students Services office have merged. The department was launched in 2018. In year 5, they are enhancing training and working with families in the community. A presentation was delivered to provide context on the foundation of the work the department does (which is continuously evolving).

Chris Moreno, Director of Financial Capability, shared information on the Future Bound Miami Children's Savings Account Program.

Future Bound Miami is the first universal Children's Savings Account (CSA) program in the state of Florida. They aim to improve financial readiness for postsecondary education for students and families in Miami-Dade County Public Schools.

The program is open to ALL Kindergarten students this year attending public elementary schools and K-8 centers in Miami-Dade County. Each public elementary school and K-8 Center has an assigned Future Bound Miami School Champion who is receiving a supplement to promote the program to kindergarten parents. All Kindergarten students are provided a financial education training day administered by Junior Achievement and we also provide free financial education workshops and one on one financial coaching to parents
